With care and clarity, the session helped students to :

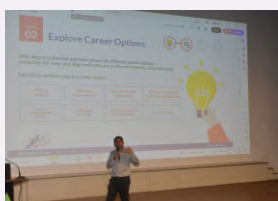

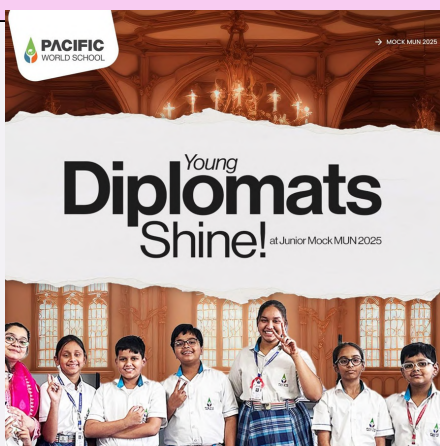
## Junior MUN (Model United Nations)

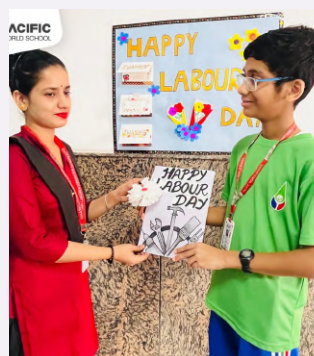


## Labour Day Celebration

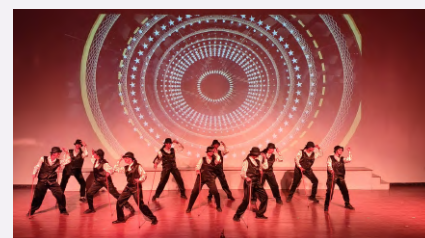

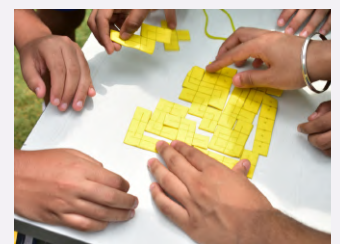
### The Power of Inter-House Activities

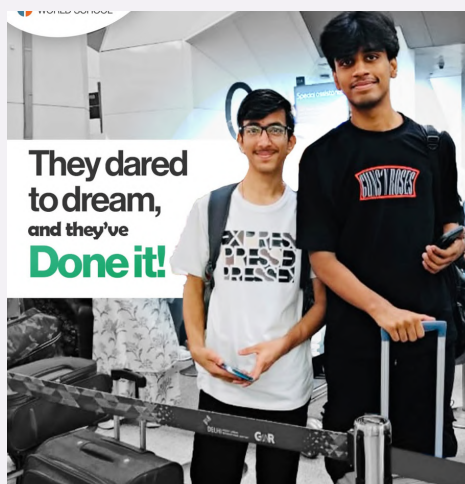


### Saathvik's French Connection
