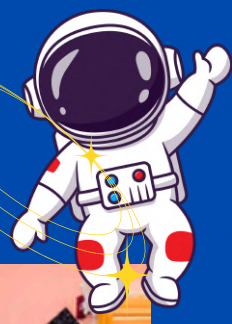

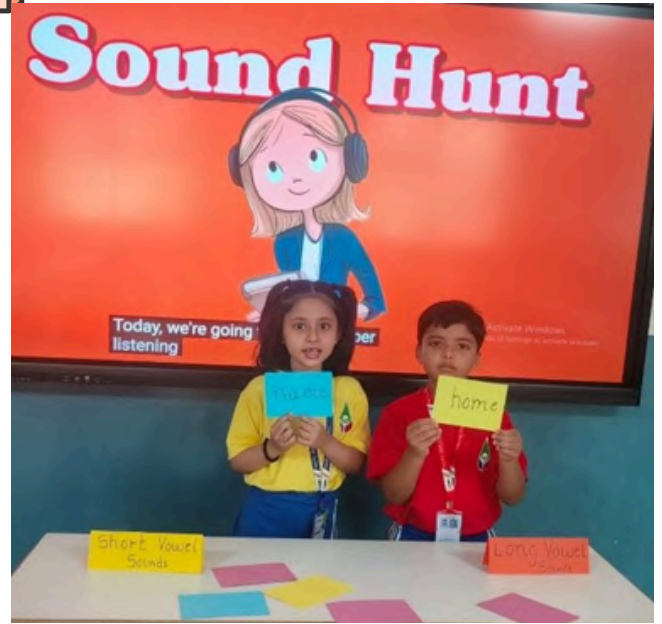
VOWEL SOUND DETECTIVE

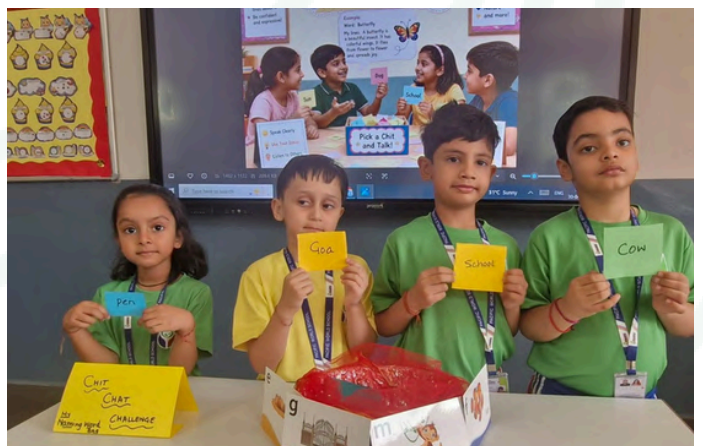
CHIT CHAT CHALLENGE

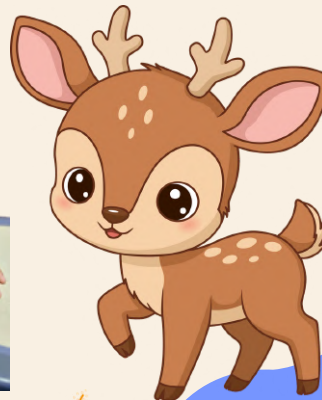
To make the session relaxing, a short meditation was conducted where children listened to soothing sounds like birds chirping and flowing water. This helped them feel calm and relaxed.

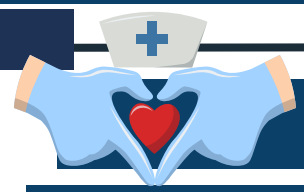
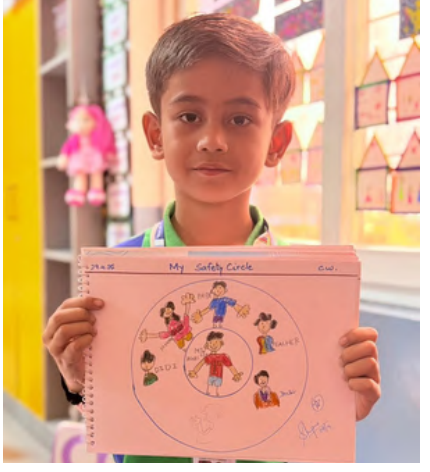
SELF AWARENESS & SELF SAFETY

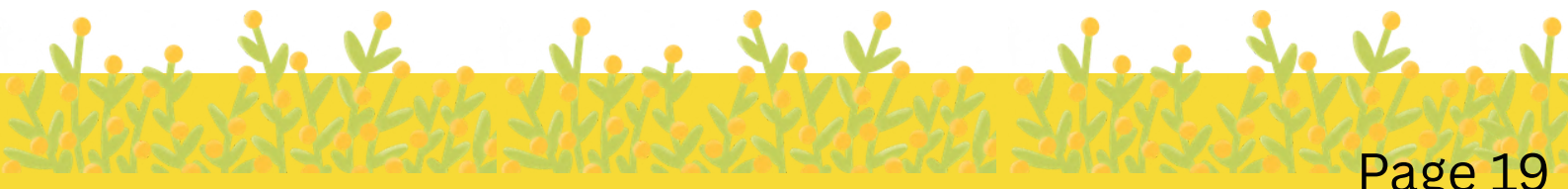


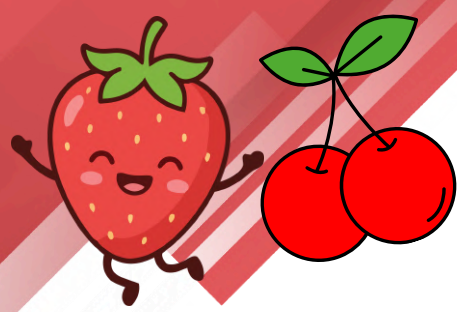
YELLOW SUNSHINE DAY



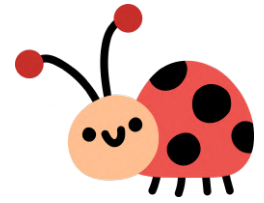

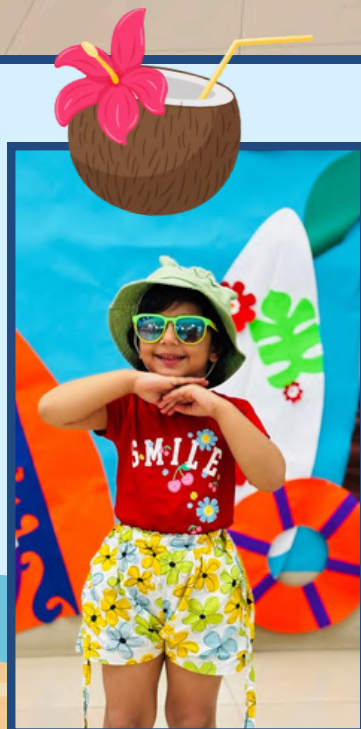




HELLO Summer
