The hands-on activity enhanced number sense, critical thinking, teamwork, and decision-making, making mathematics interactive, enjoyable, and meaningful.

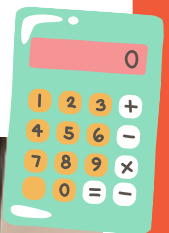

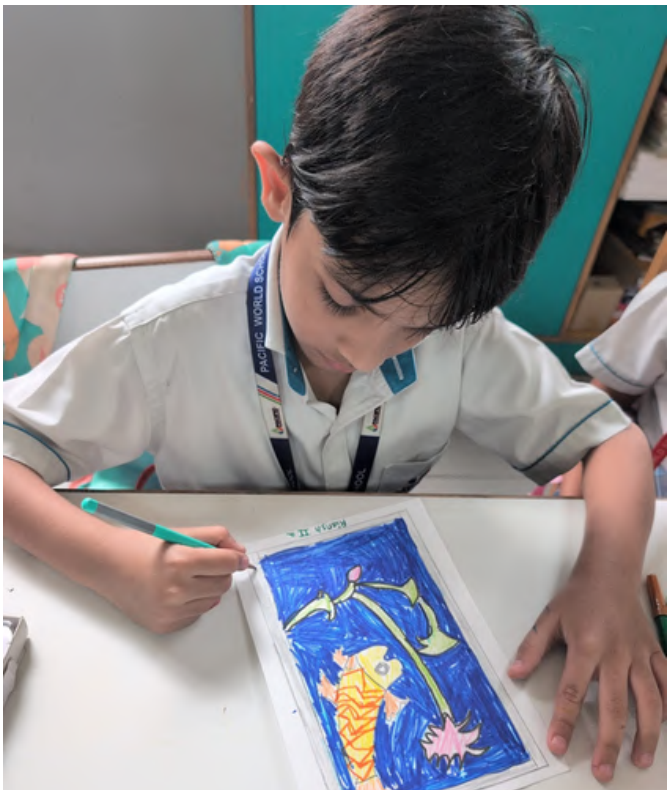

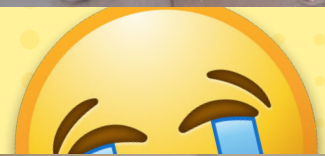


WORLD EMOJI DAY

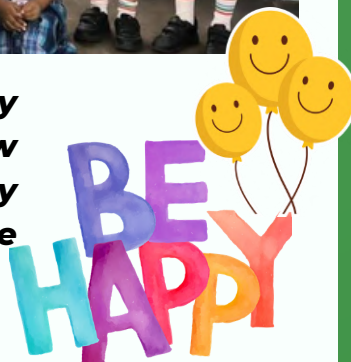
HAPPINESS IS A CHOICE - CHOOSING TO STAY POSITIVE

NATIONAL HANDLOOM DAY

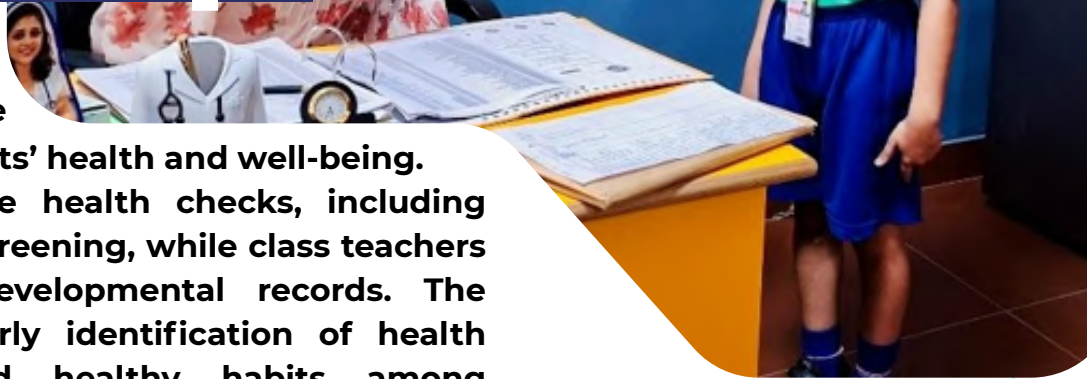

A nation grows stronger when its young voices learn to speak, listen, and lead."

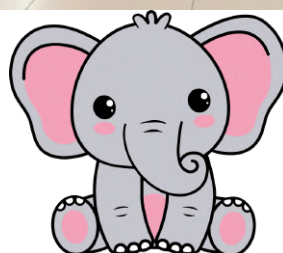

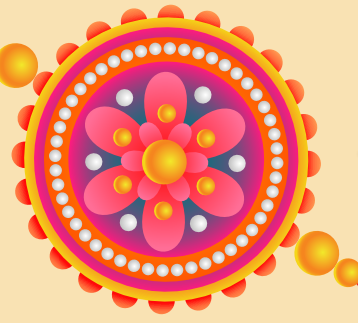
FOLKLORE DAY CELEBRATION- STORIES THAT BRING US TOGETHER (PARENTAL ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITY)

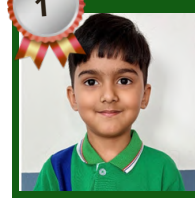
