QUESTION WORD SCAVENGER HUNT

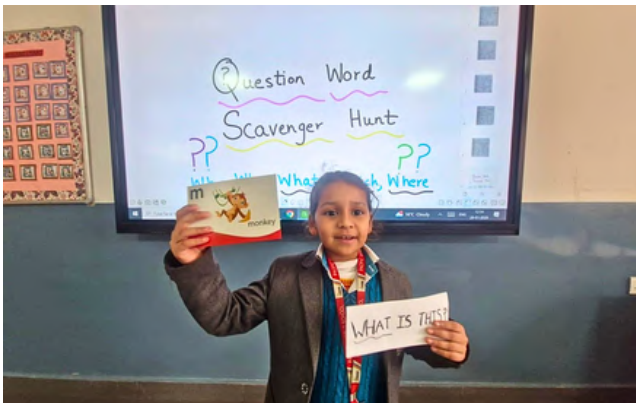

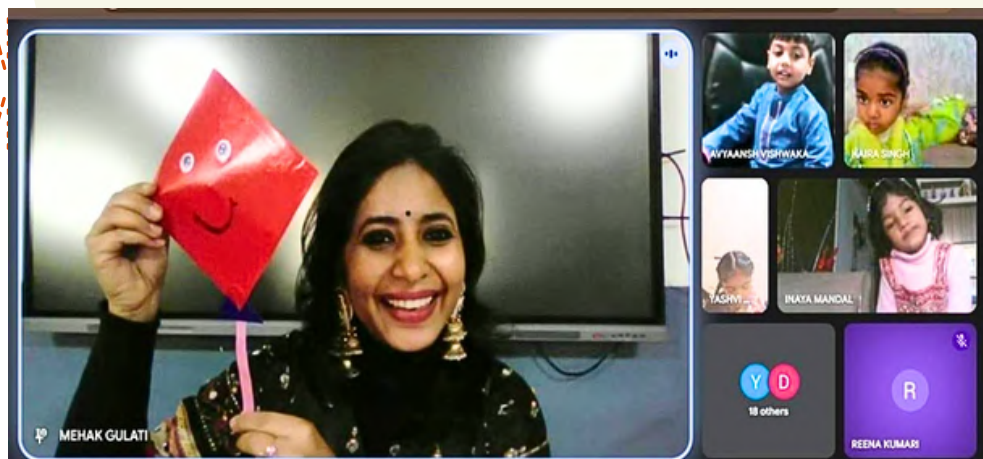

VASTU KHOJ

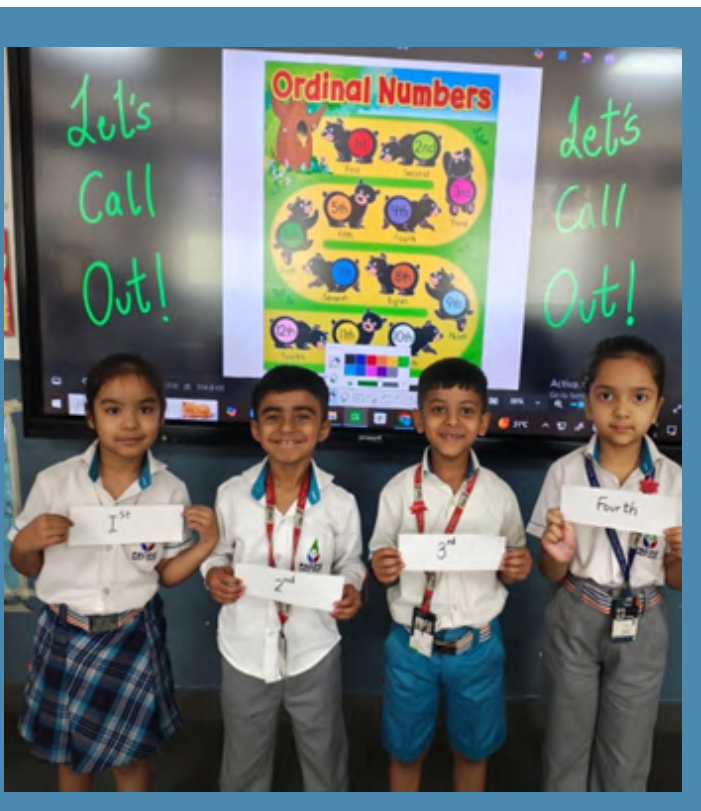
"Look around, explore, and make your home happy!"

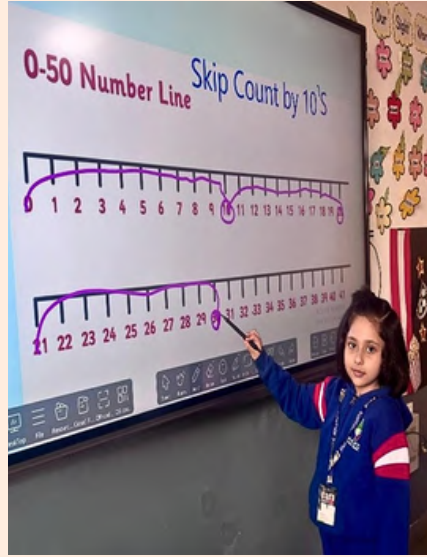
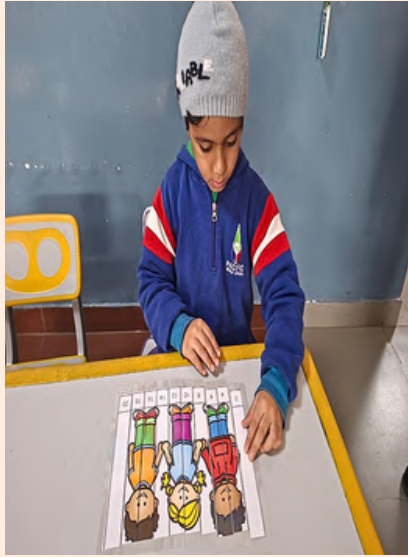

A FUN WAY TO LEARN NUMBERS

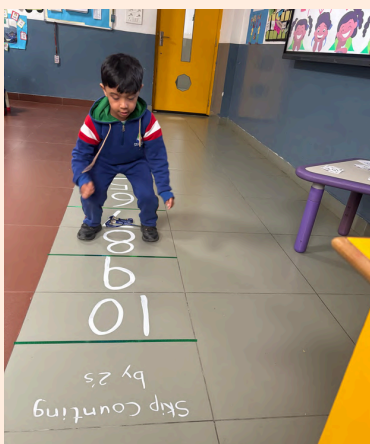

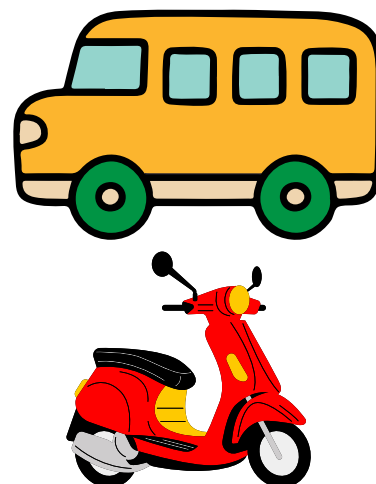


TRANSPORT MUSEUM: A JOURNEY THROUGH DIFFERENT MEANS OF TRANSPORT

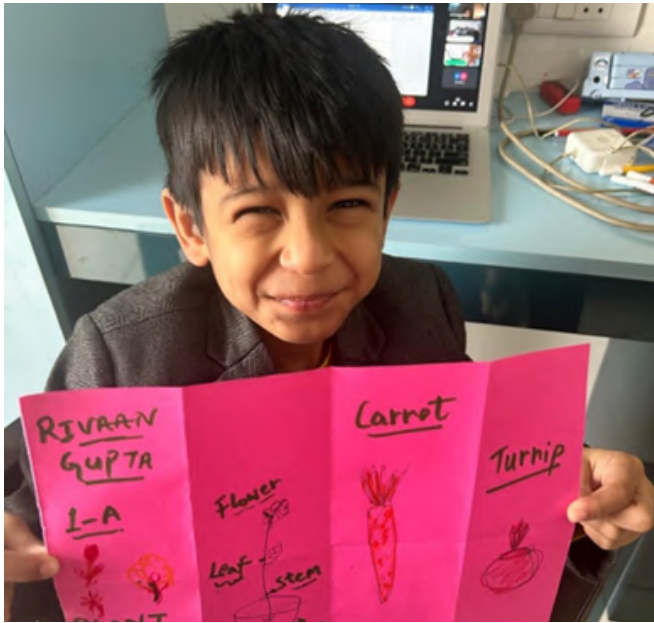

PLANTS FLIP BOOK – A GREEN JOURNEY OF LEARNING

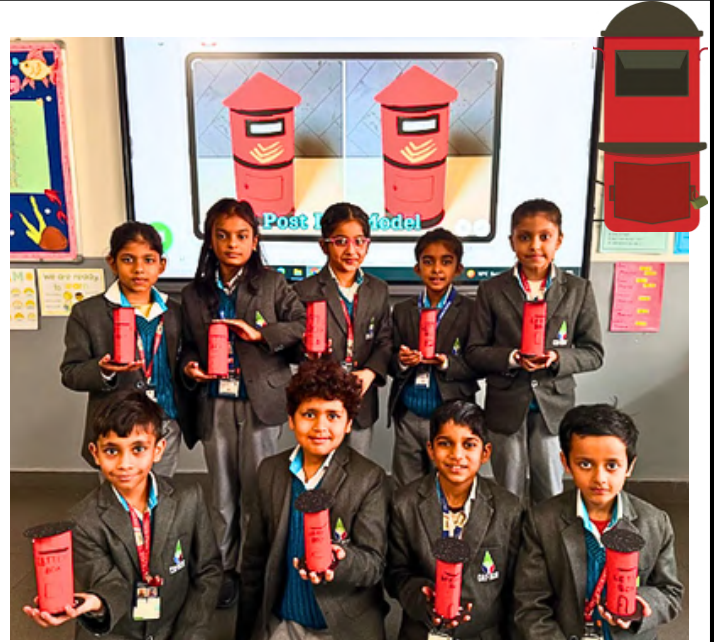

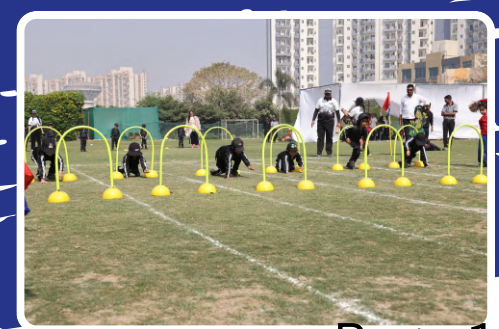
A joyful celebration where tiny feet took giant strides toward confidence and courage.

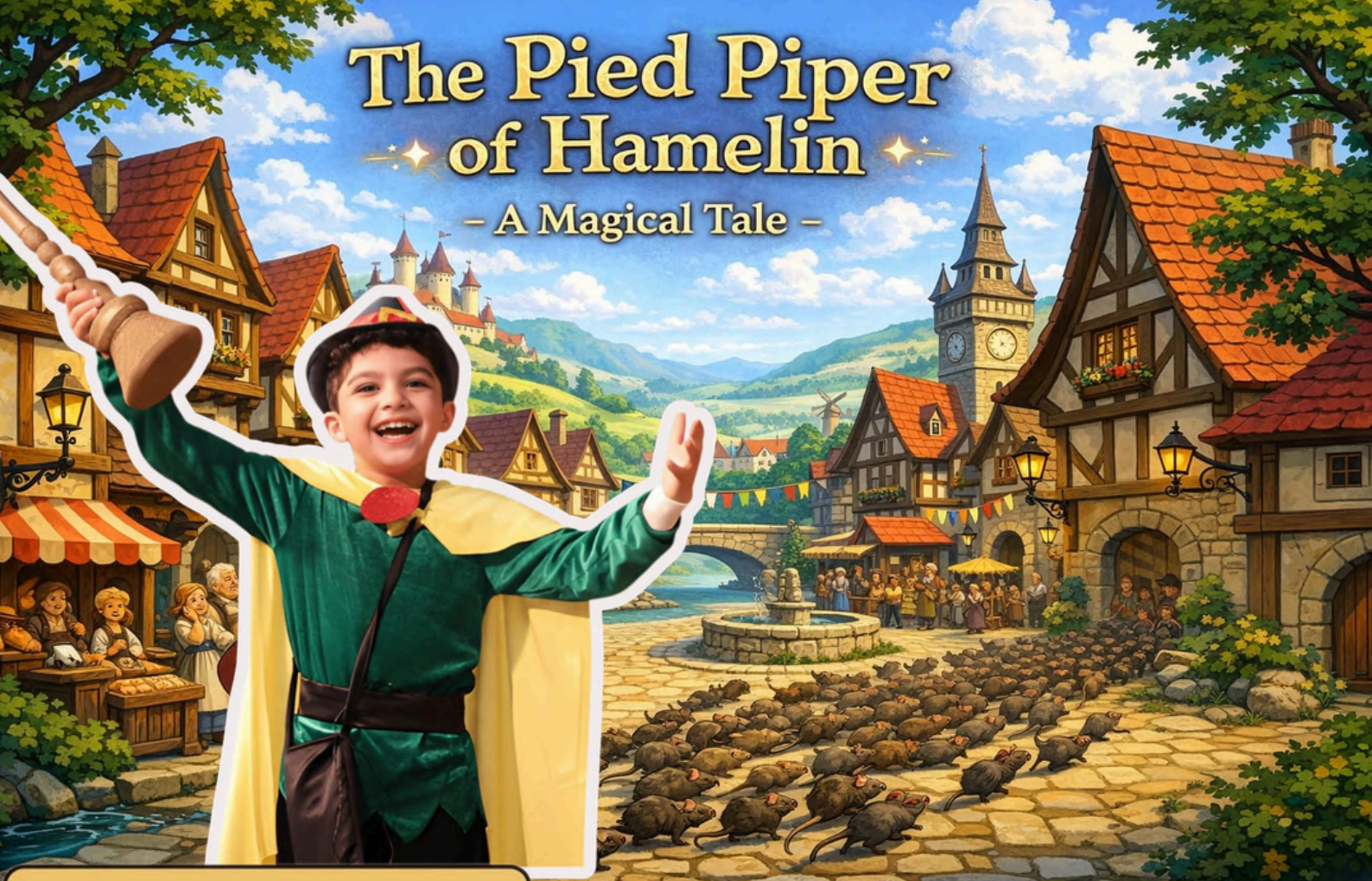

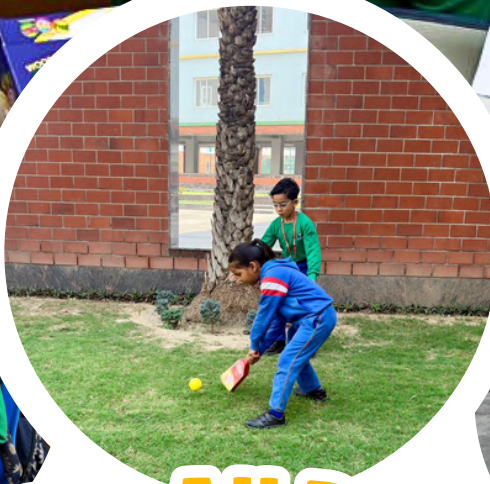

THE GREAT GAME ADVENTURE - PBL

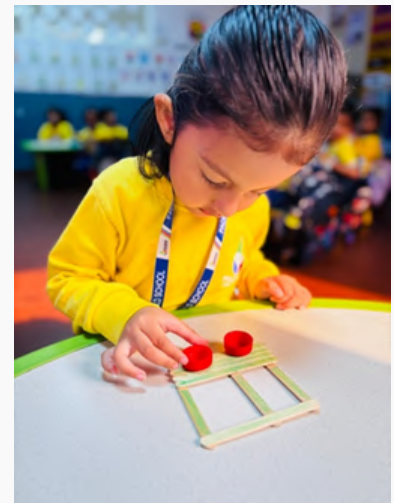
NURSERY

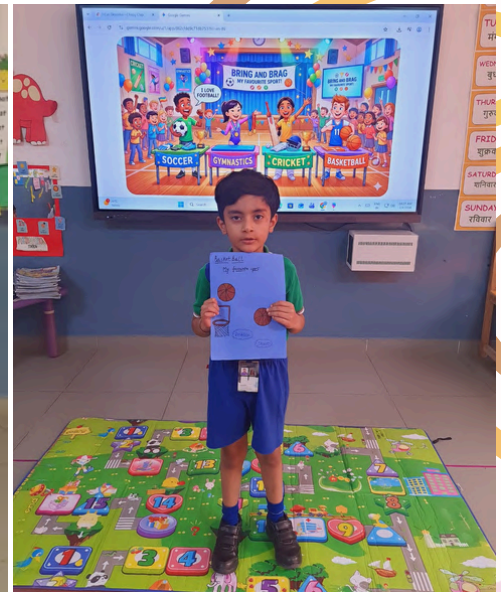
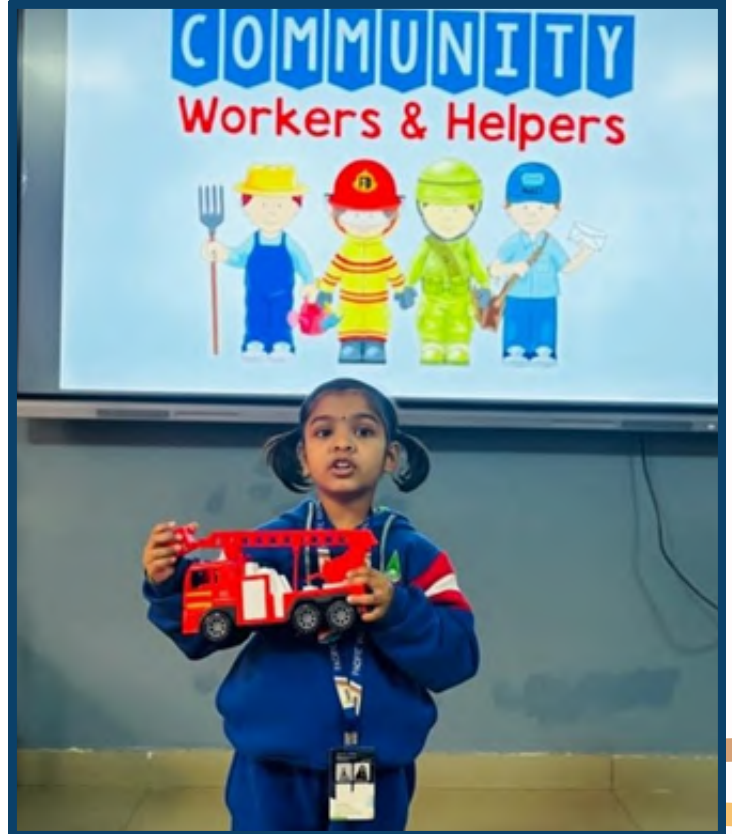
HAPPY हली

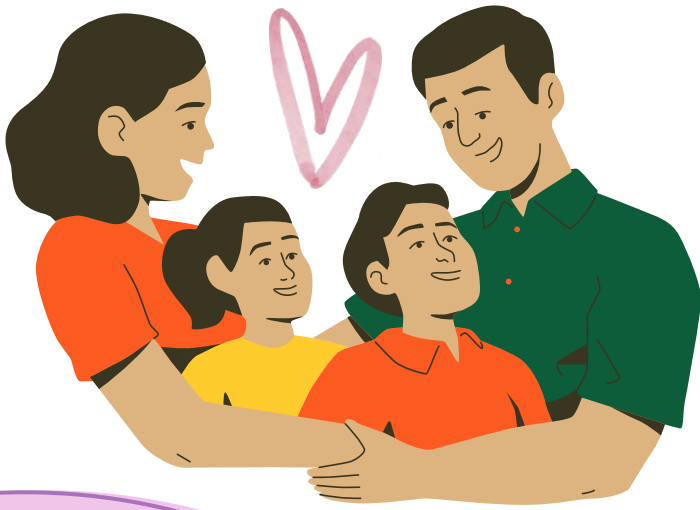
Cherishing Memories, Celebrating Growth

The highlight was watching Stuart Little while enjoying popcorn with friends. The celebration concluded with a class party, leaving the little ones with bright smiles and wonderful memories.

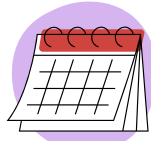




Parenting Tips:
