

Partner Quest: A Fun Way to Learn About Gender!

DISCOVERING DIGRAPHS: A FUN LEARNING JOURNEY IN KINDERGARTEN

Our Kindergarten learners were introduced to digraphs through an engaging story that sparked curiosity and helped them understand how two letters create one sound. Using the Think–Pair–Share routine, children wore “thinking hats” and confidently shared words with the targeted digraphs.

They then enjoyed a lively “Digraph Hunt”, moving around the classroom to match picture cards with the correct digraphs, strengthening sound–visual connections. The session ended with an independent reading tool that allowed learners to explore more digraph words. The children participated enthusiastically, making the entire experience joyful, interactive, and effective.

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
MATH WEEK


ANIMAL SHADOW PLAY




HUMAN RIGHTS DAY


