KATHPUTLI TANTRA

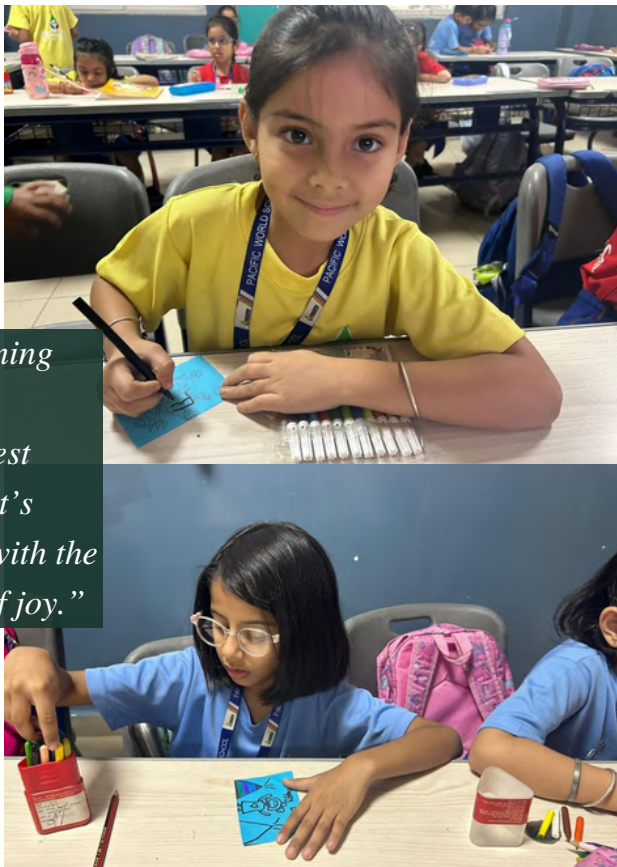

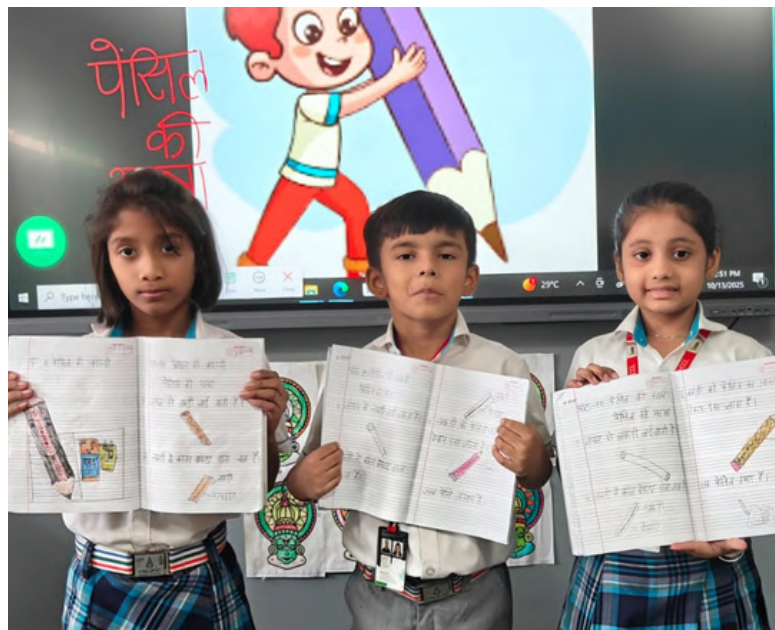

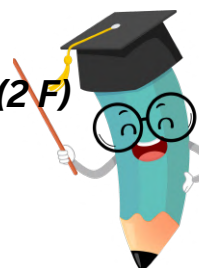
PENCIL KI YATRA

"Tell me and I forget. Teach me and I remember. Involve me and I learn."

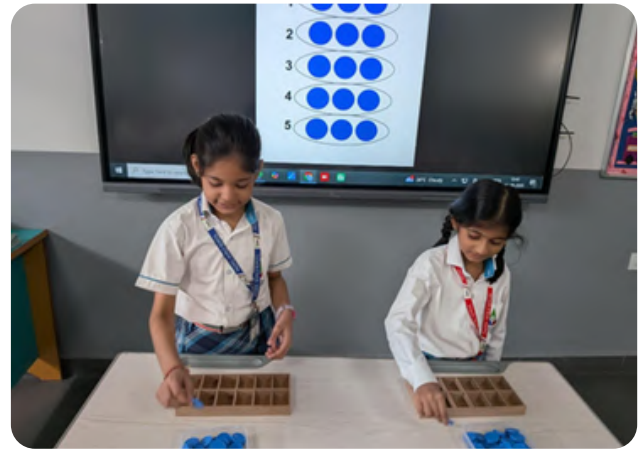
Grade 2 learners explored the concept of multiplication through two engaging hands-on activities — "Multiplication City" and Grouping with Counters.

In Multiplication City, students designed creative buildings with several floors and windows, using multiplication to find the total number of windows. For instance, 5 floors with 3 windows each helped them discover that $5 \times 3 = 15$. The colourful cityscape made learning vibrant and showed how multiplication applies to real life.

Using colourful counters and a grid box, learners also visualized multiplication as repeated addition by arranging counters in rows and columns. Both activities made math meaningful and fun, helping students understand multiplication as a practical and visual concept.

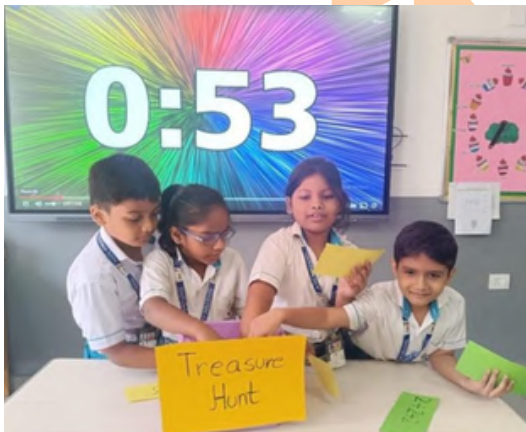


TIME TABLE TREASURE HUNT

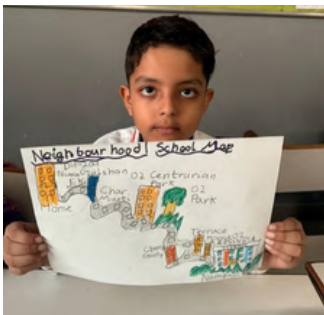


KNOW YOUR TELEPHONE NUMBER & ADDRESS

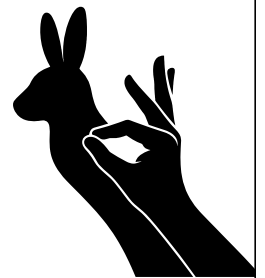
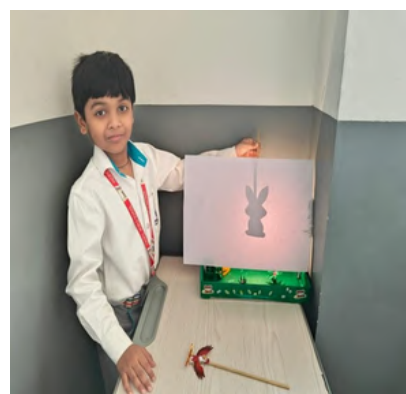

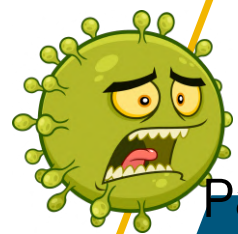


SOAP POWER: THE GERM BUSTER MAGIC!

MOON PHASE ART

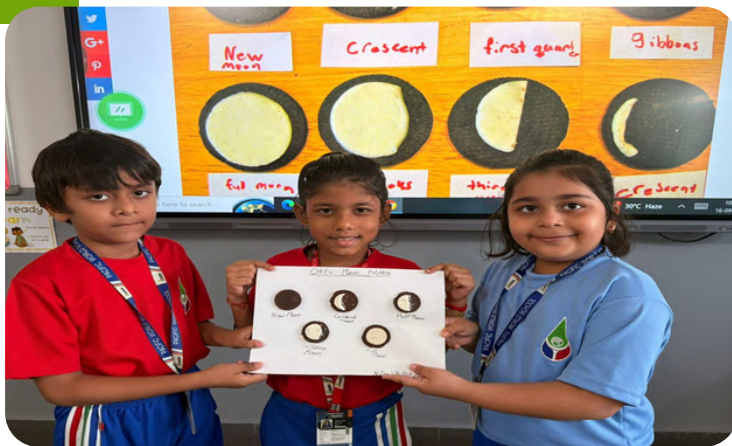


“The moon is a reminder that no matter what phase you are in, you are still whole.”

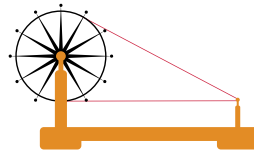

DUSSEHRA CELEBRATION

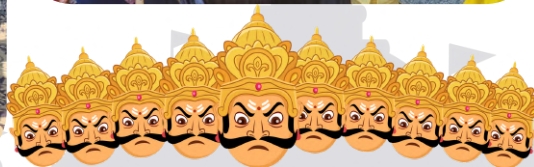
"Goodness always triumphs over evil; let this Dussehra be a reminder to light the lamp of righteousness within us."

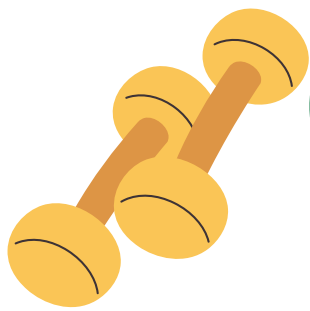

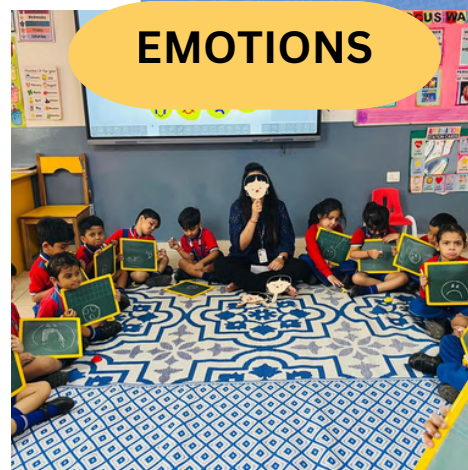

Mudra

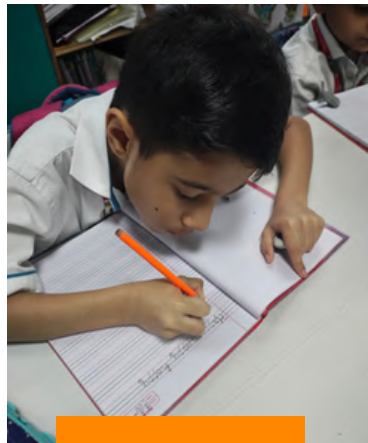


At Pacific World School, learning extends beyond textbooks through engaging hobby clubs that nurture creativity, confidence, and joy in discovery.

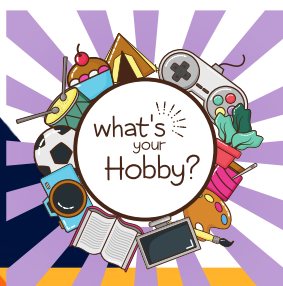

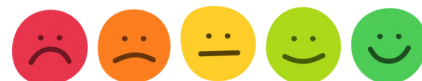


THE PURPOSE OF LIFE
