UNITED NATIONS **SECURITY COUNCIL**

AGENDA :

Deliberation on the impact of the USA IRAN conflict and the provisions necessary for the prevention of regional escalation and Global conflict in fulfilment of the UN's mandate for international peace and security.

THE GULF **BOILS** OVER



Prolonged U.S.-Iran tensions, proxy engagements, and the erosion of diplomatic safeguards have created a severe risk of regional escalation and global conflict. Urgent de-escalation and confidence-building measures are critically needed, alongside robust third-party mediation.

Recurrent brinkmanship and miscalculation continue to threaten not just the Persian Gulf but broader international security. As the primary multilateral body for peace and security, the UN plays a pivotal role in diplomacy, verification, and enforcement. Lasting stability demands a shift from crisis management to a comprehensive framework addressing both immediate flashpoints and the root causes of the conflict.

AGENDA :

Addressing the Risk of Nuclear Proliferation to Non-State Actors Amid Ongoing Global Conflicts, with Emphasis on Securing Vulnerable Nuclear Materials.

THE LOOSE ATOM



Conflict escalation, weakened state oversight, and inadequate security of vulnerable stockpiles have created a grave proliferation risk from non-state actors. Urgent, sustained international coordination and material protection guarantees are critically needed, alongside robust verification mechanisms.

Major nuclear-capable states and international bodies play a pivotal role in shaping the present geopolitical scenario. Lasting risk reduction demands a shift from ad hoc interventions to a comprehensive strategy addressing both immediate material vulnerabilities and the root causes of non-state actor access. Conflict escalation for unilateral benefits, oblivious to its consequences, remains a spontaneous fuel to the fire of global instability.

UNITED NATIONS **HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL**

AGENDA :

Addressing the Human Rights situation and Ensuring Civilian Protection in Conflict-Affected Regions of Ethiopia, with Special Emphasis on the Amhara Region and Tigray Region.

TWO REGIONS, ONE GRAVE

In Ethiopia's Amhara and Tigray regions, ongoing hostilities have unleashed widespread human rights violations—including targeted killings, sexual violence, forced displacement, and attacks on civilians and humanitarian workers. Despite the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement, fragile security, restricted access, and unresolved land and political disputes continue to endanger civilian lives.

Urgent measures are required: independent monitoring of abuses, safe and unimpeded humanitarian corridors, accountability mechanisms for all parties, and enforceable civilian protection frameworks that function beyond ceasefires.

ASSOCIATION OF SOUTH EAST ASIAN NATIONS

AGENDA : Assessing the Effectiveness of ASEAN Mechanisms in Responding to the Crises in Myanmar and Cambodia, with Emphasis on Non-Interference vs. Responsibility to Protect.



PRINCIPLES OVER PEOPLE

The post-coup crisis in Myanmar and the deteriorating human rights situation in Cambodia have tested the effectiveness of existing regional response mechanisms. The longstanding principle of non-interference in internal affairs increasingly clashes with the responsibility to protect and international human rights norms.

Key mechanisms such as special envoys and consensus-based agreements have shown limited results due to weak enforcement and internal divisions. Widespread civilian suffering and cross-border instability demand a critical assessment of what has worked and what has failed. A balanced approach is needed.

CONFERENCE OF PARTIES

AGENDA : Strengthening Global Frameworks for Environmental Protection and Climate Accountability, with Special Emphasis on the Recognition of Ecocide.

NATURE'S DAY IN COURT?

CRIME

Decades of climate summits have produced fragmented, legally weak environmental governance. Rising emissions and ecosystem collapse have outpaced voluntary pledges. A growing global movement now calls for recognizing the severe, widespread damage caused by ecocide to nature as an international crime, alongside binding climate accountability mechanisms. Existing frameworks like the Paris Agreement lack enforcement and penalties for state or corporate actors causing catastrophic harm.

The COP must deliberate on integrating ecocide into international criminal law, strengthening compliance and liability. A transformative shift is needed: from voluntary targets to enforceable legal duties, and from ecological damage as an externality to ecocide as a crime.

EUROPEAN UNION

AGENDA :

Assessing the Limitations of the European Union in Tackling Maritime Security Challenges Amid Transatlantic Tensions in the Middle East and Near-European Waters, with Reference to the Corfu Channel Case (ICJ).



EUROPE ADRIFT AT SEA

Transatlantic tensions over maritime security, particularly between the EU and the U.S. have exposed the EU's limited ability to stabilize international shipping lanes in the Middle East and near-European waters. Competing strategic interests, fragmented naval command, and reliance on NATO assets constrain EU autonomy. The 1949 CORFU Channel case remains the primary ruling on innocent passage and state responsibility for maritime safety. Yet in current crisis zones from the Red Sea to the Black Sea, the EU struggles to enforce these norms amid transatlantic friction.

A recalibrated approach is needed: clarifying the EU's independent role, reconciling the CORFU Channel doctrine with modern asymmetric threats, and preventing further destabilisation of critical sea lanes.

ALL INDIA POLITICAL PARTY MEET

AGENDA : Deliberation on Systemic Failures in India's Examination Framework and Ensuring Accountability Amid Recurring Paper Leak Scandals.

MERIT'S FUNERAL

Recurring paper leaks in India's high-stakes examinations including NEET, UGC-NET, and state recruitment tests have exposed deep systemic failures in the country's assessment framework. These breaches undermine meritocracy, derail millions of young aspirants, and trigger widespread protests, legal battles, and political deadlock. Weak surveillance infrastructure, porous supply chains, and inadequate legal deterrence have allowed leak networks to operate.

The crisis not only erodes public trust in educational and recruitment institutions but also fuels regional and partisan polarisation. Urgent, cross-cutting reforms are needed.

HISTORICAL CRISIS COMMITTEE

AGENDA : Evaluating Strategic Decision-Making and Geopolitical Realignments during the Second World War (Freeze Date: July 1942).

BEFORE THE TIDES TURNED



By July 1942, the Second World War stood at a strategic turning point. Midway had shifted the Pacific balance, Germany launched Operation Blue toward Stalingrad and the Caucasus, and Rommel threatened El Alamein and the Suez Canal. Allied unity strained over the timing of a cross-Channel invasion, while Axis powers consolidated their hold and neutral nations recalibrated their positions.

Strategic decisions at this moment on resource allocation, command failures, and diplomatic trade-offs would reshape military outcomes and post-war spheres of influence.
